



One or more scholarships of \$2000 (\$1000 per semester) for one academic year are available. All rising college freshman students planning to study anything arts-related are encouraged to apply.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Students must be planning to study an arts-related major (fine or digital arts, performance art, dance, music, band, theatre, etc.) at an accredited four-year institution. (The students must include a copy of their acceptance letter from said college.)
2. Students must also attach a written recommendation from a Georgetown County high school art-related teacher or guidance counselor.
3. Include a CD or jump drive with examples of works by the applicant. (If it's an image on the CD, it should be in JPEG (.jpg) format with a resolution of at least 180 dpi.)
4. Include a list stating the title, description, and dates of the works shown. This can be in the form of a Word (.doc) or PDF (.pdf) document.
5. The applicant must fully complete and return the two-page Scholarship Application form (see next pages).
6. Applicant is required to attend one Pawleys Island Festival of Music & Art public event.
7. Awards are based on talent and financial need of student, and student must have at least a 2.5 GPA.

DEADLINE

The deadline for submissions is 5:00 PM, Friday, May 2, 2025

Applications must be made through the guidance office of a Georgetown County high school which will forward the information to PIFMA.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All scholarship monies will be given to the high school and presented to the scholarship winner at Senior Awards Night. Scholarship applications are reviewed by the PIFMA Scholarship Committee. Students will be notified of the results at the discretion of the school guidance office.

Internal Revenue Service regulations may require that non-profit organizations receive and retain evidence that scholarship monies are used for their given purpose. Therefore, the Kathryn Bryan Metts Scholarship may require proof that course work was completed successfully. If requested, this information must be sent to the Kathryn Bryan Metts Scholarship office at the end of each semester, and may be in the form of a grade report, a progress report from a professor or administrator, or any other verifiable indication that the individual is using the given scholarship funds toward his or her artistic education.

This scholarship is for one academic year only. You must reapply for any future years and receipt of the award once does not guarantee that the recipient will receive the scholarship in any future years.
